



# **High Level Process for Long-term Recovery Planning**





#### RTF / Branch Kickoff

Establish the working structure for RTF and launch branches. Identify immediate needs and goals to address.

Launch website.

#### **RTF & Branch** Coordination

Identify recovery objectives: inform impact and needs assessment: establish projects; incorporate community's priorities; inform long term planning; oversee recovery plan implementation

#### **Identifying & Analyzing Unmet** Needs

Hurricane lan storm impact analysis, and a cursory look at outstanding needs that will begin to shape recovery priorities

#### Community **Engagement\***

Comprehensive community outreach to inform and validate needs. identify solutions, and validate planning.

#### Hurricane lan **Disaster Recovery** & Resilience Plan

A framework for Lee County's recovery from Hurricane lan, including prioritized projects, funding sources, and key stakeholders

#### **Emergent Needs & Pertinent Recovery Implementation**


Conduct recovery operations and manage recovery funding streams: short-term. intermediate, long-term.



## Requirements of Sunshine Law



- The Lee County Long Term Recovery Task Force and Branches shall be subject to, and each member shall be responsible for compliance with the Florida Sunshine Law and the Florida Public Records Act
- **Public Meetings Guidance:** Florida Statute Section 286.011 applies to meetings of public boards and commissions where two or more members of the same board or commission are discussing some matter which foreseeably will come before the board or commission
- Requirements for Sunshine Law:
  - Public notice, posted 7-10 days prior
  - Open meetings
  - Minutes, posted 5-7 days post



## **Education & Workforce Branch**



The Education & Workforce Branch will develop recommendations regarding educational opportunities that serve the current Southwest Florida economy but are also designed to anticipate changes as a new economy emerges enabling the long-term recovery of the region

#### **Branch actions:**

- Develop and recommend community engagement plan
- Engage with existing coalitions and partnerships
- Identify gaps in current planning efforts due to emergent issues caused by Hurricane lan
- Develop and recommend Initial Branch Priorities
- Develop and recommend initiatives to be integrated into Branch Action Plan, which will be incorporated into the overall Recovery and Resiliency Plan


