



High Level Process for Long-term Recovery Planning





RTF / Branch Kickoff

Establish the working structure for RTF and launch branches. Identify immediate needs and goals to address.

Launch website.

RTF & Branch Coordination

Identify recovery objectives; inform impact and needs assessment: establish projects; incorporate community's priorities; inform long term planning; oversee recovery plan implementation

Identifying & Analyzing Unmet Needs

Hurricane Ian storm impact analysis, and a cursory look at outstanding needs that will begin to shape recovery priorities

Community **Engagement***

Comprehensive community outreach to inform and validate needs. identify solutions. and validate planning.

Hurricane lan **Disaster Recovery** & Resilience Plan

A framework for Lee County's recovery from Hurricane lan, including prioritized projects, funding sources, and key stakeholders

Emergent Needs & Pertinent Recovery Implementation


Conduct recovery operations and manage recovery funding streams: short-term. intermediate, long-term.



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Requirements of Sunshine Law



- The Lee County Long Term Recovery Task Force and Branches shall be subject to, and each member shall be responsible for compliance with the Florida Sunshine Law and the Florida Public Records Act
- **Public Meetings Guidance:** Florida Statute Section 286.011 applies to meetings of public boards and commissions where two or more members of the same board or commission are discussing some matter which foreseeably will come before the board or commission
- Requirements for Sunshine Law:
 - Public notice, posted 7-10 days prior
 - Open meetings
 - Minutes, posted 5-7 days post



Housing Branch



The focus of the Housing Branch is on providing attainable housing solutions for all residents and building methods to support the needs of the community and workforce.

- Housing was a crisis, pre-lan.
- **Branch actions:**
 - Develop and recommend community engagement plan
 - Survey existing housing in development, available land and infrastructure, and financing
 - Develop and recommend Initial Branch Priorities
 - Develop and recommend initiatives to be integrated into Branch Action Plan, which will be incorporated into the overall Recovery and Resiliency Plan





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Initial Branch Priorities



- Initial ideas to include:
 - Attainable housing and innovative building methods
 - Workforce housing located near places of employment (*From RTF Members*)
 - Key partners are Bright Community Trust, Counselors of Real Estate, UF College of Design/Construction/Planning FIBER
 - Potential use of Buckingham property- 500 acres, off of Alico Rd.



Initial Branch Priorities



- **Guiding Questions in Discussion:**
 - Ensuring the repair and resilient rebuilding of homes will be a primary challenge for the Lee County area in the months and years to come.
 - What priorities could lead to direct actions, policy recommendations or initiatives that should be included in the Recovery and Resiliency Plan

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
