

Relevant Real-World Examples

- Constructed Wetlands: Curry Lake in Babcock Ranch serves as a model for surface-water management strategies. About 70 acres of land have been rehydrated to previous conditions.
- Bioswales: Cape Coral launched a pilot program funded by \$2.2 million in Total Maximum Daily Load grant funding from the Department of Environmental Protection to replace 1,600 catch basins and install approximately 9,000 lineal feet of bioswales in fall 2020.



Branches will need to accomplish the following to successfully develop an action plan:




Participate in workshops related to Branch priorities/initiatives.
