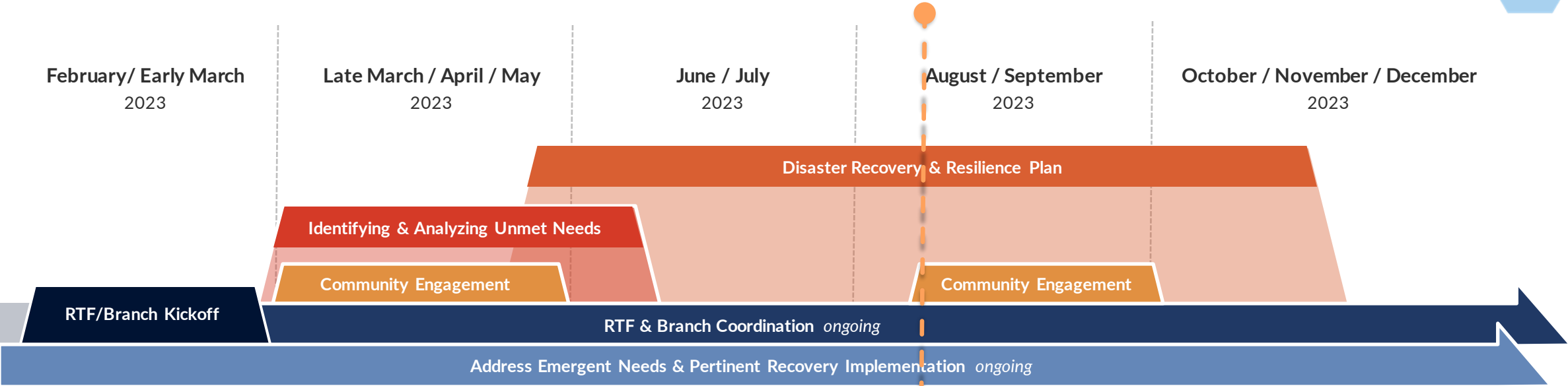
Recovery Task Force



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Timeline for Long-term Recovery Planning



RTF / Branch Kickoff

Establish the working structure for RTF and launch branches. Identify immediate needs and goals to address.

Launch website.

RTF & Branch Coordination

Identify recovery objectives; inform impact and needs assessment; establish projects; incorporate community's priorities; inform long term planning; oversee recovery plan implementation.

Identifying & Analyzing Unmet Needs

Hurricane Ian storm impact analysis, and a cursory look at outstanding needs that will begin to shape recovery priorities.

Community Engagement

Comprehensive community outreach to inform and validate needs, identify solutions, and validate planning.

Hurricane Ian Disaster Recovery & Resilience Plan

A framework for Lee County's recovery from Hurricane Ian, including prioritized projects, funding sources, and key stakeholders.

Emergent Needs & Pertinent Recovery Implementation

Conduct recovery operations and manage recovery funding streams: short-term, intermediate, long-term.

RTF is forum to identify emergent and time sensitive needs and identifying best path forward.

Purpose:

- Provide **prioritization recommendations** for existing plans and projects;
- Recommend **new initiatives**; and
- Identify key **policy changes** that can support community resilience.

Informs community stakeholders of existing stormwater vulnerabilities, consider projected future risks and developments as well as provide a well sourced, unified resource for all planning efforts involving or impacting stormwater infrastructure.	• Flood maps • Future land use maps • Wetlands map • Stormwater infrastructure map • Water utility map • Vulnerable populations map • Map of shared public spaces • Map of railways • Planned community development maps • Commercial development maps • Damage assessments maps

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Initiative Profiles



P&C 01: Assess emergency logistical resource needs of critical services and identify funding streams to acquire resources that fill these gaps.

P&C 02: Develop and maintain pre-existing recovery and distribution centers to streamline recovery operations after a disaster.

P&C 03: Incorporate cost recovery planning into preparedness efforts to increase municipal resilience.

P&C 04: Address gaps in communication capabilities in immediate post- disaster operations.

P&C 05: Perform community assessments on identified sector vulnerabilities and existing infrastructure to prioritize needs in future planning efforts, including the Disaster Advisory Council's Local Mitigation Strategy, to ensure future funding is prioritized for the projects that create the most resilience factoring in growth.

P&C 06: Develop neighborhood plans in identified communities.

P&C 07: Expand Joint Local Mitigation Plan to include identified vulnerabilities.

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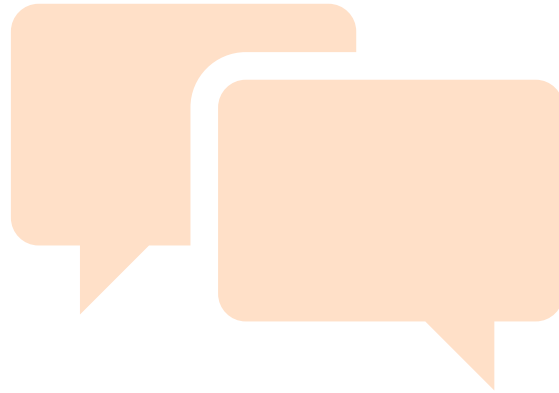

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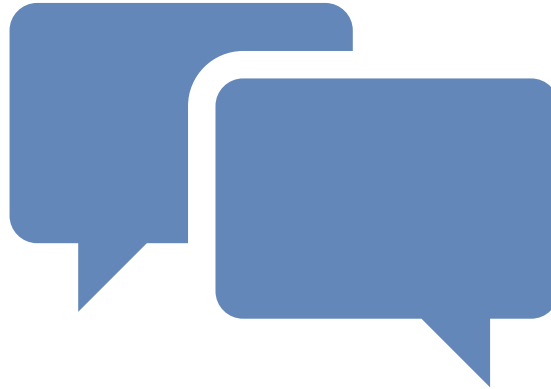
